The individuation process is a term created by the famous psychologist carl gustav jung to describe the process of becoming aware of oneself, of one's make-up, and the way to discover one's true, inner self. although the structure is basic and simple, the contents require a much deeper understanding.

Few people have had as much influence on modern psychology as carl jung; we have jung to thank for concepts like extroversion and introversion, archetypes, modern dream analysis, and the collective unconscious. psychological terms coined by jung include the archetype, the complex, synchronicity, and it is from his work that the myers-briggs type indicator (mbti) was developed, a popular staple. Overview: this guide explores the individuation process as described by carl jung and jungian psychology.. sigmund freud was a pioneer in the field of psychology. he named his new field psychoanalysis, as in the study of psychotic and mentally ill patients. early in carl jung's career, freud was like a father figure to him. Ego death is a "complete loss of subjective self-identity". the term is used in various intertwined contexts, with related meanings. in jungian psychology, the synonymous term psychic death is used, which refers to a fundamental transformation of the psyche. in death and rebirth mythology, ego death is a phase of self-surrender and transition, as described by joseph campbell in his research on *Becoming: an introduction to jung's concept of individuation* reflects the ideas of carl gustav jung. his idea of a process called individuation has sustained the authors dedication to a lifelong work of psychoanalysis. psychotherapists know the value of jung's approach through clinical results, that is, watching people enlarge their consciousness and change their attitudes and behavior. Carl jung: archetypes and analytical psychology exploring the realm of carl jung's collective unconscious and the archetypes that live within it. Definition. the archetype is a concept first developed in psychology by carl jung. the "archetype is an explanatory paraphrase of the platonic eidos" (jung et. al. 1979) the concept of archetype was already in use at the time of saint augustine, who, in *de deversis quaestionibus*, speaks of "ideas which are not yet formed which are contained in the divine intelligence."

The archetypes that are most important in shaping behavior are: the persona, the anima and animus, the shadow and the self --the most important archetype to the development and functioning of the personality. Understanding the archetypes involving the eight functions of type (beebe model) the key to understanding exactly how functions play out in each of mbti's 16 types is the archetypes. jung's larger theories included hundreds of archetypes, which are "character roles" of sorts (model of a hypothetical person in a particular role), within the psyche.
