Protagonist & antagonist name: protagonist: the main character of a narrative (story) who enters into conflict (often because of the antagonist). the audience is supposed to identify with the protagonist throughout the narrative.

I. types of characters protagonist vs. antagonist (opposites) a. protagonist the main character of the story b. antagonist the character(s), thing(s) or force(s) that works against the protagonist. static vs. dynamic characters (opposites) c. static characters stays the same throughout the story. character traits hardly changes or develops.
